- I locate the Tropic of Cancer, the Tropic of Capricorn and the Greenwich meridian on a map.

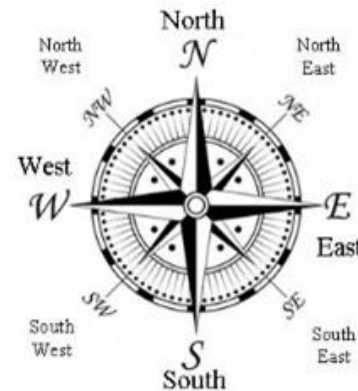
Key Vocabulary:

Grid Reference (including Eastings and Northings)	Numbers used to pinpoint a particular location on a map. Numbered lines called eastings and northings are used to pinpoint a square section on a map. Eastings are numbers running from left to right; Northings are numbers running bottom to top.
Ordnance Survey map	maps produced by the national mapping agency of Great Britain,
Symbols (OS map symbols)	Motorway, Campsite, Viewpoint, Picnic Site, Sports Centre, Museum, Nature Reserve
Terrain	The shape of a piece of land with regards its physical features
Tor	High rocky hills.

I will learn:

- the position of these lines of latitude (lines that run across Earth): Equator, The Tropic of Cancer, The Tropic of Capricorn, Arctic Circle and Antarctic Circle.
- how to estimate or measure six figure grid references.
- the Prime Meridian is a line of longitude, which runs through London.
- that anything lying east of the Prime of Meridian is in the Eastern Hemisphere and anything west of the Prime of Meridian is in the Western Hemisphere.
