Key Vocabulary:

latitude	lines of latitude run in an east-west direction across Earth
longitude	lines of longitude run in a north-south direction across Earth
Prime Meridian	a line of longitude that divides Earth into two equal parts: the Eastern Hemisphere and the Western Hemisphere
Tropic of Cancer	a line of latitude that marks the northern edge of the tropics
Tropic of Capricorn	a line of latitude that marks the southern edge of the tropics
transport links	different forms of transportation, such as roads, railways, or air services, that connect two places
visitor capacity	the maximum amounts and types of visitor use that an area can accommodate
