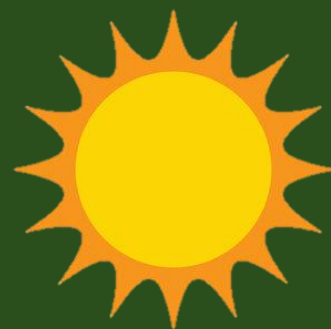


CURRICULUM INFORMATION



Year 1- Summer Term

Here is an overview of what your child will be learning this term which we hope you will find useful. We would welcome any comments or questions you might have.



Dinosaur Planet

The Enchanted Woodland



English

Pupils will be reading a collection of the Harry and the dinosaurs stories by Ian Whybrow and Adrian Reynolds, using a range of skills to produce a descriptive piece of writing. They will continue to write creatively, sequencing sentences orally before writing them. Also, begin to create a book review.

The pupils will continue to develop and consolidate their knowledge and understanding of English grammar for Year 1, focusing on time conjunctions, nouns, adjectives and verbs.

Pupils will continue to practise their phonics skills in preparation for their Phonics Screening Check in June.

Maths

Pupils will continue to develop fluency in working with whole numbers, counting and recognising the place value of each digit number. Count in multiples of twos, fives and tens. Also, representing numbers using objects and pictorial representations.

Pupils will also be recapping key topics in order to fully prepare them for when they move into Year 2.

Pupils will have the opportunity to solve a range of mathematical problems, ensuring that they are using all of the skills learnt in Reception and Year 1.

Other Curriculum Areas

Science - Classifying animals into classification groups and plants.

Geography - Key features of a place (Jurassic Coast) from pictures and using maps, including compass points

History - Focusing on someone famous, significant to historical discoveries (Mary Anning).

P.E. - developing fundamental movement skills, building teamwork, and introducing simple games and athletic activities.

R.E. - Joy, Knowledge and Spiritual Understanding.

Arts - Exploring colour and texture.

Pupils will also learn about relationships, health and a variety of social issues, including British Values through PSHE, citizenship, pastoral sessions and assemblies.

Things to do at home:

- Read every day and record it in your record book.
- Practise your spellings- tests will be on a Friday!
- Practise your phonics for the phonics screening test.
- Learn your key vocabulary.
