The Scented Garden

English

Pupils will read a variety of texts including The Pirates Next Door and Eddie's Garden.

Pupils will write recounts, captions, rhymes, instructions, information texts and stories. Pupils will use capital letters, full stops, finger spaces and commas in their writing consistently.

Pupils will be given the opportunity to develop their reading through reading independently, using the school library and listening to stories to develop an enthusiasm for books.

Maths

Pupils will continue to use place value, comparing and ordering numbers to 100 and reading and writing numerals in words when solving problems.

Pupils will also focus on addition, subtraction, multiplication, division and word problems.

Pupils will also investigate solving problems involving money, time, interpreting data and identifying and describing 2D and 3D shapes.

Pupils will be learning 2, 3, 5 and 10 times tables.



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Other Curriculum Areas

Science Everyday materials and their suitability for different purposes and growing plants and flowers.

Computing Using search engines to find information and making spreadsheets.

Humanities Finding out about famous explorers, Compass directions, locating continents and countries, finding out about Japan and its culture and traditions.

P.E. Cricket and Tennis.

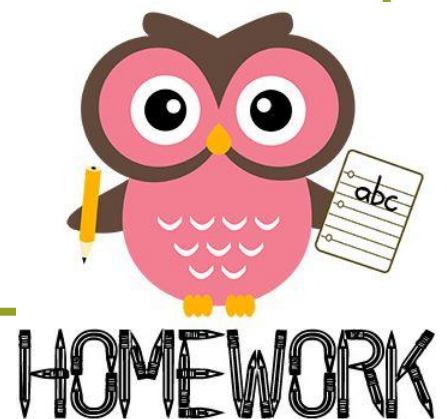
R.E. Creating harmony and unity, Participating and willing to lead, caring for others animals and the environments.
