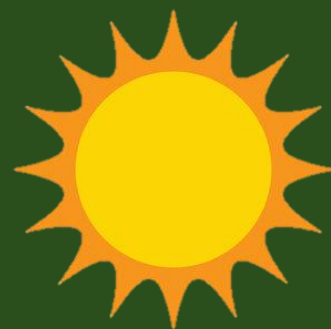
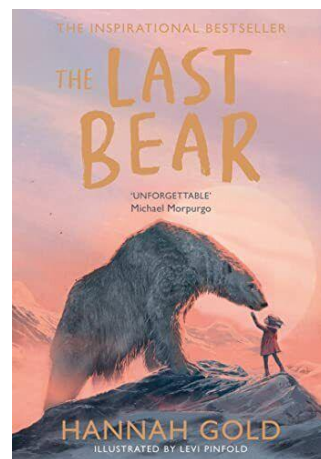
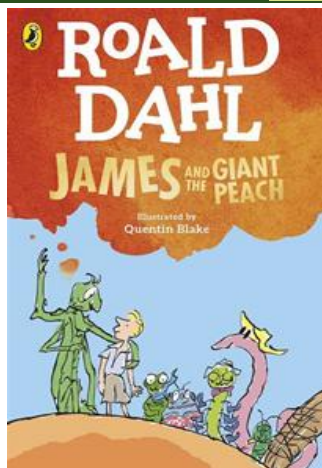


CURRICULUM INFORMATION



Year 4- Summer Term

Here is an overview of what your child will be learning this term which we hope you will find useful. We would welcome any comments or questions you might have.



English

Pupils will be reading *James and the Giant Peach* by Roald Dahl and using a range of skills to produce dilemma narratives. Later in the term, pupils will also read *The Last Bear* by Hannah Gold. They will continue to write creatively and also begin to write diary entries, a formal letter and a pledge.

The pupils will continue to develop and consolidate their knowledge and understanding of English grammar for Year 4, focusing on prefixes and suffixes and understand how to use them. They will also use homophones, pronouns and organise paragraphs around a theme.

Maths

Pupils will continue to develop their knowledge of Decimals – comparing, ordering and rounding.

Pupils will also be revising and developing their knowledge and understanding of Money – ordering, rounding and estimating amounts. They will be using their skills to solve two-step problems focusing on multiplication and division.

Pupils will have the opportunity to develop their understanding of Statistics, interpreting charts, tables and line graphs.

Our final topic is Geometry, identifying, comparing and ordering angles.



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Other Curriculum Areas

Science- Sound and Electricity

Computing- Creating logos and moving animations.

Humanities- Native America and early settlers. The history of Birmingham and famous Brummies.

P.E.- Tag-rugby, rounders and athletics

R.E.- Living by rules, Being temperate, Appreciating beauty, Diversity and uniqueness.

Arts- Exploring Native American art, making dream catchers, investigating the work of David Hockney and painting.

Pupils will also learn about relationships, health and a variety of social issues, including British Values through PSHE, citizenship, pastoral sessions and assemblies.
