- A legacy is things that exist after someone dies or after a civilisation ends.

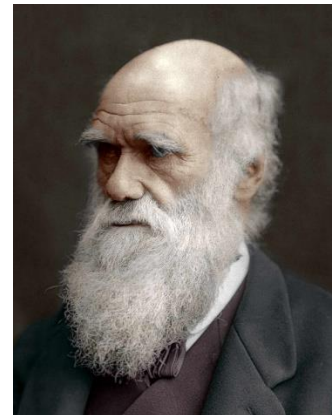
Key Vocabulary:

chronological	a list of events in the order they happened
controversy	public disagreement of views
extinct	an animal or plant species that has died out and is no longer present in the world population e.g. dinosaurs
fossil	the remains of a once-living organism preserved as rock
Jurassic Coast	part of the South coast of England, form in Jurassic times
naturalist	a person who studies the natural world
On the Origin of Species	Scientific text written by Charles Darwin in 1859
palaeontologist	a scientist who studies the fossilised remains of different organisms
Theory of Evolution	Charles Darwins ideas of how organisms changed over time
