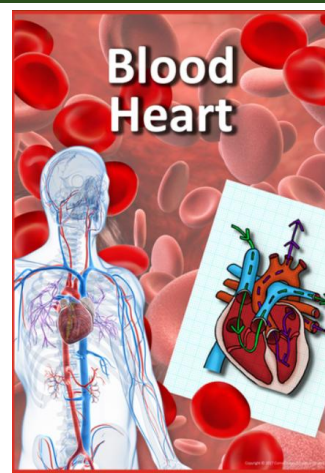


CURRICULUM INFORMATION



Year 6- Spring Term

Here is an overview of what your child will be learning this term which we hope you will find useful. We would welcome any comments or questions you might have.



English

Pupils will be reading 'Letters From The Lighthouse' by Emma Carroll, a World War Two evacuation inspired story and 'Pig Heart Boy' by Malorie Blackman, a text that explores the issues surrounding organ transplants. They will be using these texts as models for their own historical writing: letters, narratives and informative writing: reports and guides.

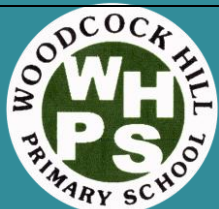
Pupils will continue to study the skills needed for Year 6 punctuation and grammar, including the active and passive voice, modal verbs and using cohesive devices.

Maths

Pupils will continue to develop their understanding of number through studying decimals, percentages, algebra and ratio.

Pupils will also recap and enhance their understanding of perimeter, area, volume and converting between different measurements. Pupils will also revise their knowledge of statistics.

This term we will continue to practise reasoning style questions across the Mathematical topics to prepare for our upcoming SATs.
