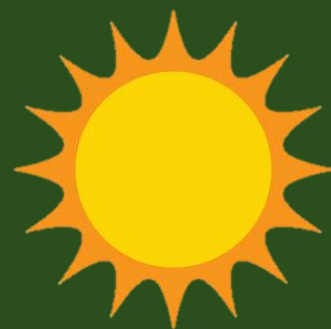
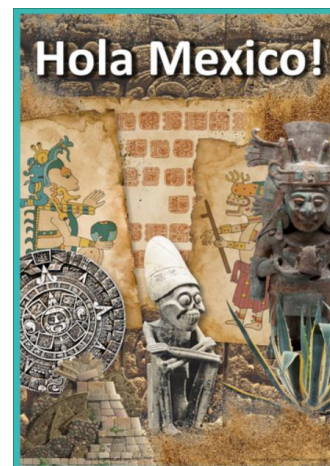
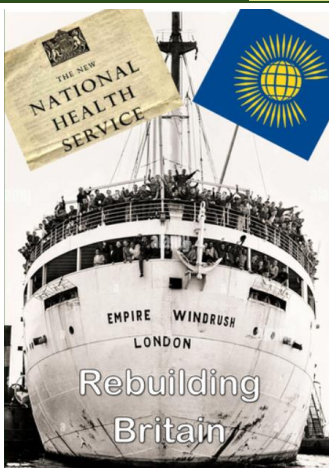


CURRICULUM INFORMATION



Year 6- Summer Term

Here is an overview of what your child will be learning this term which we hope you will find useful. We would welcome any comments or questions you might have.



English

Pupils will be reading Windrush Child by Benjamin Zephaniah and using a range of skills to produce newspaper reports. Later in the term, pupils will also read Holes by Louis Sachar. They will continue to write creatively and also begin to write flashback narrative and travel guides.

The pupils will continue to develop and consolidate their knowledge and understanding of English grammar for Year 6, focusing on using semi colons, hyphens and dashes. They will also use relative and embedded clauses.

Maths

Pupils will continue to develop their knowledge of the properties of shapes through geometry work, including the different features of circle.

Pupils will also be revising key concepts and methods from across Key Stage 2 in order to fully prepare them for their SATs and Secondary School.

Pupils will have the opportunity to solve a range of mathematical problems using real life contexts using all of the skills learnt throughout their primary education.

Science- Electricity and Light

Computing- Creating text based adventure games and quizzes

Humanities- Rebuilding Britain after WW2, the Ancient Mayans, building a new settlement and a location study of Mexico.

P.E.- Rounders and Athletics

Pupils will also learn about relationships, health and a variety of social issues, including British Values through PSHE, citizenship, pastoral sessions and assemblies.
