Talk to any friends or family about what they know, or remember, about World War Two. Write down their responses.	Make a scrapbook of World War Two images and write captions for each one. Think about how each person in the picture is feeling and write a suitable adjective for each picture. 	Write a news report for a significant day or event during the Second World War. 	Find out what happened to Birmingham during the war. Were people evacuated? Make a fact file or storyboard to share your findings. 	Create a travel brochure style article for a place in Britain. Why should you go there? What could you visit there?
Imagine you are an evacuee- what would you pack in your suitcase to take with you? Draw a suitcase with its contents labelled to show why you would take it item. Remember you are only allowed one small suitcase!	 Imagine you had been evacuated to Budmouth Point, along with Olive and Cliff. Write a postcard home to tell them about your life there.	Choose one of the wartime leaders we have studied. Write a biography or create a timeline of their life.	A popular wartime phrase was 'make do and mend.' Design (or even try making) a new toy children could play with during the war. Remember there was little technology around then and the make do and mend philosophy involved using items that were already in the home.	Imagine an evacuee child has joined your family. Where would you take them to in your area and why? Create a leaflet for them that explains the local area.
